AMATEURISM ELIGIBILITY WAIVER**

I hereby apply to participate in the 2013 Scoonie Penn T.O.U.C.H. Hoops Classic (the "Tournament") *June 28-30, 2013*.

I understand that the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) has the following regulations on Amateurism:

NCAA Regulations on Amateurism

If you want to participate in NCAA Division I or II athletics, you must be certified as an amateur student-athlete. The NCAA Eligibility Center will determine the amateurism eligibility of all freshman and transfer college-bound student-athletes for initial participation at an NCAA Division I or II college or university. In Division III, certification of an individual's amateurism status is completed by each college or university, not the NCAA Eligibility Center.

College-bound student-athletes may participate in amateur sports clubs as long as they do not receive expenses in excess of travel, lodging or equipment for practice or competition. A prospect may accept prize money based on performance in an open competition **as long as the prize is awarded by the sponsor of the event and the amount of the prize does not exceed the student-athlete's expenses to compete in the event.** College or university representatives may not help with fundraising efforts for a student-athlete's amateur club team.

Actual and necessary expenses are limited to the following:

- (a) Meals and lodging directly tied to competition and practice held in preparation for such competition;
- (b) Transportation (i.e., expenses to and from practice and competition, cost of transportation from home to training/practice site at the beginning of the season and from training/practice site to home at the end of the season);
- (c) Apparel, equipment and supplies related to participation on the team;
- (d) Coaching and instruction, use of facilities and entry fees;
- (e) Health/medical insurance, medical treatment and physical therapy; and
- (f) Other reasonable expenses (e.g., laundry money).

I understand that the Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) has the following regulations on Amateurism:

OHSAA Regulations on Amateurism

You will lose your amateur status and forfeit your eligibility if you:

- **Compete for money or other monetary compensation.**
- Capitalize on your athletic fame by receiving money, merchandise or services.
- Receive expenses or compensation from a sponsor unless that sponsor is a recognized amateur governing body or organization, recognized by a member school or is your parent or guardian.

- Sign a contract or make a commitment to play professional athletics.
- Receive services, merchandize or any form of financial assistance from professional sports organization.
- Compete with a professional athletics team even if no pay is received.
- Enter into an agreement with a sports or marketing agent.

I understand that by participating in the 2012 Scoonie T.O.U.C.H. Hoops Classic I am no longer eligible to play for the OHSSA and the NCAA.

I hereby fully and forever release, discharge, and agree not to sue, bring legal or any other action against Metropolitan Community Services-T.O.U.C.H. ,Ohio Dominican University, any tournament affiliates, or any sponsors, their officers, directors, agents, employees, representatives, and successors for the loss of my eligibility for the OHSAA and the NCAA .

I understand and agree that this Amateurism Eligibility Waiver be binding upon my heirs, assigns and any personal entity acting upon my behalf, including a parent, guardian or next friend.

I have read the above items of the Amateurism Eligibility Waiver, understand them, agree to abide by them, and hereby acknowledge that I have read and understand this Amateurism Eligibility Waiver.
